
# **CONSTRUCTION:**

# THE GOD OF MIRACLES:

We have already shared before that 600,000 Venezuelan immigrants have come to Chile. We want to tell you the story of Chris, a young 37-year-old widow who arrived in Rancagua last year. Her 5 children remained in Venezuela. After a short time here, she was diagnosed with terminal cancer. The doctors said that she had six months to live. A friend told her about our church and that's how she arrived on the first Sunday with her boyfriend. That same day we invited them to our house for dinner and we shared the gospel with them. With tears in her eyes, she opened her heart to Christ. Melissa began discipling her immediately. As the days passed her health worsened and her pain increased. She was weaker and in intense pain. Seeing her in that state, her boyfriend abandoned her and because of her condition. At that time, she was unable to work.

There she was, terminally ill, in pain, and completely alone. Different people in our church began to pay the rent for a room and every week we brought her food.

There was a point when we didn't know what to do. Should we buy her a ticket to return to her country and spend the last days of her life with her children and family? Do we keep her here and take responsibility for her until the end? We knew that in Venezuela she would not have medicine even for her pain. We prayed to the Lord and decided to support her and help her get medical treatment. Our church prayed intensely for her. Suddenly we saw that she was a little better and regained her strength. Finally, after several months of prayer taking and taking natural treatments for cancer she went to the doctor for an update on her condition. They told her that her exams showed that the cancer had completely disappeared. The doctors couldn't understand what happened to her. They held a medical meeting to analyze her case and asked her questions, but Chris only told them: "I came to know Christ and he healed me."

Today she is still in our church, she found work and was now able to bring one of her children to Chile. She enjoys a new physical and spiritual life and shares her testimony to everyone saying that she met the God of miracles.
