We paid the airport tax, presented our visas, stopped at the checkpoints, drank only bottled water, carried only one lithium battery per person, and complied with the list of dos and don'ts without question.

If we were to have an extended stay, say a few months, we might re-think the inconvenient and uncomfortable requirements and begin to make excuses to circumvent our compliance with them.

The prophet Jeremiah acknowledged that the Lord is always righteous, "...yet let me talk with thee of thy judgments." (Jeremiah 12:1) Jeremiah was not in agreement with the way the wicked people were prospering and dishonoring God. He wanted the Lord to change His ways according to what he (Jeremiah) thought was best. WEO Ministries has so much to accomplish this coming year, so we are happy to inform you that there are numerous prayer, volunteer and financial support opportunities that God is providing us with. With humility, I ask you as one of WEO's team members, to please seek guidance from the Holy Spirit to see where He wants you to help out...

Amazingly, 2024 is over, but not without witnessing some phenomenal works and miracles provided through the mighty hand of our Lord and savior.

October/November Trip to Africa: There were a total of seven (7) of us that traveled to Africa. Two teams; one team of one (1) that visited the orphanages in Liberia and Sierra Leone to profile and conduct Good News Club meetings with the children, and a second team of six (6) that went to Moyamba Junction, Sierra Leone, to work on the Makripodis College roof.

The first team, comprised solely of my dear wife Cynthia, traveled extensively throughout Liberia, visiting most of the

WEO churches and schools there.



Good News Club and Wordless Book:

Cynthia was able to minister to the children (and adults) using a method from the US based organization called Child Evangelism Fellowship, or CEF.

CEF establishes Good News Clubs in schools and churches by incorporating the use of the "Wordless Book" to teach children about Jesus.



This method of evangelism is very powerful and one that the children can easily learn and replicate. In fact, one do

easily learn and replicate. In fact, one doesn't even need to know how to read or write in order to be able to use it. Aside from the children enjoying the CEF evangelism teaching, even the local Pastors and lay teachers were excited about how easy and fun it is to teach using the CEF material. Shown here is Pastor Theophilus teaching one of the sessions.



Cynthia made almost 1000 of these tiny books (2" x 2") and

handed them out to the children, pastors and teachers for their use. Each of the wordless book pages has a specific color that is used to tell the story of Jesus. WEO's goal is to establish "Good News" Clubs throughout our African ministry a little bit at a time.

Sewing Ministry at the Orphanages: One thing about WEO's RCM Director is that she LOVES to sew.

This trip, Cynthia took with her lots of crochet yarn that generous donors provided. During her stay at each of the orphanages, she brought out the yarn and showed the girls and guys how to crochet. This was an immediate "hit" as the



children were all super excited to learn this trade.

Many of the children made hats, scarves and other things to



send home with Mummy Cynthia to give to their sponsors.

Makripodis College: The second team of six (6) are shown below. Much work was accomplished through your prayers,

along with quite a bit of sweat. We are especially thankful for the hard working men native to Africa, as they worked so hard in the blistering heat all day.



Once again, the volunteers from the US were an outstanding group of Christian men that seemed to know just what needed to done and quickly assumed leadership roles to direct the construction activities. WEO President Dan Yanchak is shown in the far left of the previous photo, and is the supreme mastermind and overall construction leader of the Makripodis College multipurpose building. Dan arranged several meetings prior to our trip to help us gain insight and experience with the equipment, materials and techniques that would be used during the roof installation.

Shown here is a trench being dug and the first few courses of foundation block being laid around the perimeter of the



building. This was all done by our local work force digging tirelessly and often through rocky, volcanic soil.

In conjunction with the foundation work, others were involved with the inventory and

staging of all the roof materials. Believe me, we were all quite overwhelmed at first trying to figure out what each of the pieces would be used for and where exactly they should go. Thankfully we had a good group of detectives that were able to solve this complex riddle, and it looks as though we might have only a few "extra" pieces when we are finished.



To initiate the roof panel installation, we first had to install retaining wire and insulation to keep the oppressive heat from radiating into the lower (occupied) part of the building. After that came the roofing panels. Each is 16" wide by almost 40'

in length, so it took some special handling to ensure each panel was placed on the roof and into its proper position



without being bent. Shown here is the installation team at work.

There is so much more I could write about, but before ending this edition, I wanted to mention something wonderful that I witnessed during our time at the construction site. The Chief



Muslim leader, of the Moyamba Junction District, Alhaji Mansaray, who is head of over 1500 muslims in the area, visited the

college site while we were working. He was curious as to what we were doing, so Mike Makripodis and Tony McConaghy took him on a tour and then sat with him to explain our ministry, the focus of Makripodis College and answer any questions he had. During the course of these discussions, Mike Makripodis was able to share the gospel story with him and plant the seeds of salvation in his mind. Although no immediate decision was made to accept Jesus on his part, we are continuing to pray for this man and the potential he has for reaching a great number of others who are unsaved.


